Outreach Training and Technical Assistance Program

In 2016 the Western Rural Development Center (WRDC), with support from the other Regional Rural Development Centers, led a national collaboration with the USDA-NIFA Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR) Program to develop and deliver online training modules about the SBIR grant proposal and submission process. The training specifically targeted Cooperative Extension Service specialists and agents to prepare them to better assist potential SBIR grant applicants.
